## From The Pastor

As we come to the end of one year, and begin another, I want to express my gratitude to the many churches who have partnered with us in ministry with our neighbors in need. You have had fundraisers and supported us financially in other ways, organized "collections" of various items we need, sent volunteer teams, and invited us to share the story of New Life ministries to groups in your congregation. We have worshipped together, eaten together, prayed together, and are developing new ministries together. By lifting up New Life Ministries as a missional priority, there has become a groundswell of individuals who desire to share in this ministry in some way. Truly, we come together as one body united by the love of Christ, to be in servant ministry with our neighbors. I know that many of your lives have been changed by your sharing in this ministry. 


