## **FROM THE PASTOR**

Many of you, if you have been to New Life on a Sunday or Tuesday know **Vincent**. And if you know him, you must definitely like him. It’s hard not to! I have never seen him in a bad mood, nor heard him complain. He is FULL of energy, and just makes you feel good when you talk with him. Each time he comes, the first thing he says to me is, “Hi Pastor Jennifer! Is there anything special you’d like me to do for you today?” He’s been nagging me for a month to get the air conditioners in — he just needs someone with a drill to ensure that they stay in the windows. Now it’s beginning to be hot, and they are still not in, so he’s REALLY on it now. Hopefully by the time you read this, he will have motivated the right people to make it happen. **Vincent** won’t even really benefit from the air conditioners — he just wants to make sure that the young disciples, and **Laura**, our new Minister of Youth and Families, and I are comfortable this summer. This is just one example of **Vincent’s** generous, compassionate spirit that is so endearing.

Just a couple months ago, **Vincent** FINALLY moved into his own apartment after years of living outside. He was thrilled! **Bill** and I went to check it out, and he wanted to show us every nook and cranny, and for us to pray together to give thanks to God for giving him the apartment. He knew who had been at work through a number of people to make this dream a reality. There’s just one problem — he now lives on the south end of town on Harrison Pike. Too far for the vans to go on Sunday morning to pick him up. So, for the first couple of weeks there, **Vincent** felt “stranded,” unable to get to New Life. He told one of the people that helped him get the apartment that if he just had a bike, he would be able to get to church, and to other appointments (but mostly to church). Through the generosity of a couple people, we were able to get him a bike. When we delivered it, it was as if we had just given him a Ferrari! Now, on both Sundays and Tuesdays, when the weather cooperates, **Vincent** rides his bike to church. It takes him AT LEAST AN HOUR to make the journey. But to him, it’s worth every minute and every mile. And we are always so glad to see him when he comes. New Life just isn’t the same when **Vincent**, with his energetic and joyful spirit, isn’t here.

My guess is that none of us — even if we come from a distance — have to go to that effort to get to church. Most of us just need to get out of bed, get ready, and drive a short distance. I hope on Sunday mornings when you “don’t feel like coming to church,” or have other options for things to do, or have just gotten out of the habit of coming to worship, you will think of **Vincent**, and be challenged and inspired to make your way to New Life (or whatever faith community you are part of) with the same enthusiasm and joy that he does. I am confident that you will feel better emotionally and spiritually, having done so. And I want you to know that New Life just isn’t the same if you’re not here.

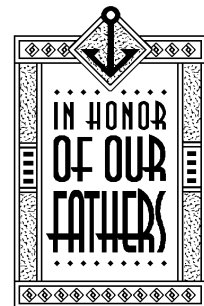

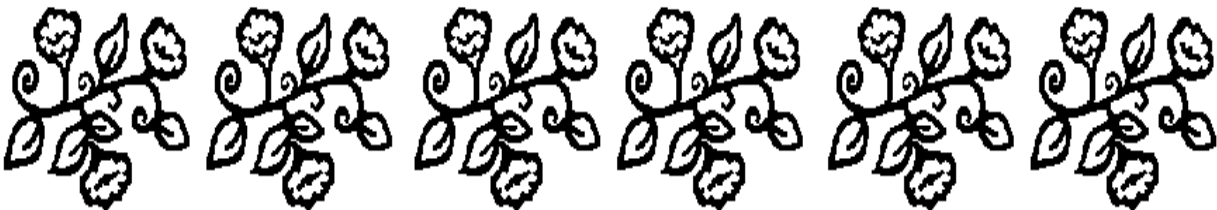

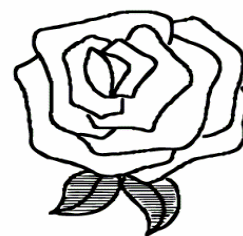
