## FROM THE PASTOR

I am writing this article while attending the West Ohio Annual Conference in Lakeside, Ohio. It is wonderful to gather with about 1600 Christians to worship and learn, as well as reconnect with friends and peers I don't see very often. The delegates, both lay and clergy, are making decisions about the priorities and positions of United Methodists in our Conference, including opposing the war in Iraq and a commitment to support the Global Aids Fund (We contributed more than \$250 as a congregation). We are also about the business of electing delegates to General (where the Book of Discipline, which outlines both the theology and law of our Church, is modified and/or affirmed) and Jurisdictional Conferences (where Bishops are elected and assigned), which meet every 4 years.

But, one of the most important events is when **Bishop Ough** sets the appointments for the coming year. As many of you know, we have an "itinerant system," which means that pastors are appointed by the Bishop, and can be moved from their current church, to serve another one whenever it seems appropriate for the overall mission of the church. So, I was thrilled to see my name listed beside New Life for the 12th time, confirming that I have been reappointed to this Christ centered, diverse community of faith, which is committed to *loving, welcoming and serving all people in the name of Jesus Christ.*

It is an incredible blessing to be in ministry with each one of you — New Life members and friends, members of partner churches, neighbors, young disciples, seminary students, and all who pass through our building for a wide range of reasons. You encourage me, challenge me, surprise me, love me, and have helped me to grow as a pastor and a follower of Christ.

As I come to church most days to worship, serve, converse, pray and grow in relationship with all of you, as fellow disciples, I anticipate that absolutely anything can happen! That's one of the things I love about New Life!

**Bill** and I "process" Sunday morning over brunch at First Watch each week, and as we talk about all of the unpredictable celebrations and challenges, all of the interesting people and stories, what the young disciples did, the professions of faith and even the difficult confrontations, we simply conclude with gratitude for "just another day at New Life Church!"

And hopefully, we will have many, many more days when we can make that declaration.

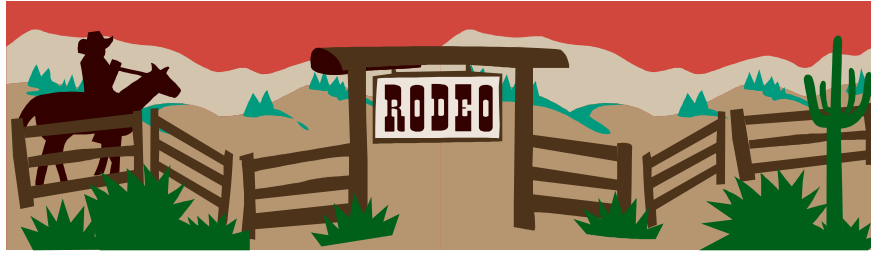

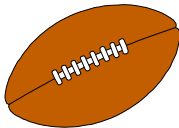

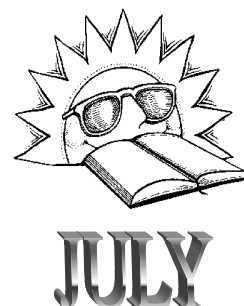
